In the first project implementation phase, partners have been focusing on researching water course tourism establishments which can be used as good practice examples for the development of the sustainable tourism advisor competences.

Project meeting in Romania

On the 7th of July, the BLUE TOURISM consortium met in Miercurea - Ciuc, Romania, to hold its second partner meeting, which can be considered really successful. The accent was put on summarising all the completed and upcoming tasks, alongside discussions related to partners' experiences during the first project phases. In the afternoon a field trip to one of the Romanian case study locations took place. The partnership visited <u>Saint Anna Lake</u>, the only volcanic crater lake in Central Europe where the manager of the lake presented future plans for implementing more sustainable tourism around the lake, which consists, among others prohibiting the use of cars in the area, conservation of botanical diversity and the rainfed lake, stimulating the development of local communities, electric pontoon boat charged with solar panels and many more.
